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In this edition of our newsletter, we are delighted to feature Dr. Renette van Zyl, whose journey at King David Victory Park began in 1981. What started as a teaching post became a four-decade legacy of service, leadership and inspiration. From pioneering Afrikaans cultural experiences to embracing Jewish life and values with deep respect, she touched countless lives. Her story is one of gratitude, lifelong learning and the profound difference a dedicated teacher can make across generations.

THE TEACHER FEATURE: LEGENDS IN EDUCATION

I must admit that I never wanted to become a teacher, but life had something else in store for me. Teaching chose me and after almost 50 years of teaching, I am still grateful.

Growing up in a small town in Mpumalanga, I was totally unaware of Jewish customs. I just remember my mother bringing home Matzah that she got from her Jewish employer during Easter.

I joined the King David Victory Park Team in 1981 as an Afrikaans teacher. Little did I know that I was about to embark on a 40-year learning curve. A year later I was appointed as Head of the Afrikaans Department and subsequently as Vice Principal.

One sunny afternoon, while running up and down umpiring a netball match between Linksfield and Victory Park, I noticed Mr. Wolf. I thanked him for coming all the way from Victory Park to watch the girls play. There was a polite nod, but Mr. Wolf clearly did not recognize me. I was perplexed, as I had been at the school for almost six months. It suddenly dawned on me that this must be Linksfield's Mr. Wolf. Instead of keeping quiet, I blurted out: "Sorry, you are the wrong Mr. Wolf!" upon which Elliot replied with a smile: "I am the right Mr. Wolf."

Our Afrikaans Department was a formidable team, always thinking up innovative ideas to expose the students to Afrikaans culture, plays and music. Our trips to Potchefstroom to attend the *Aardklop Arts and Culture Festival* became a highlight. Picnics where we played *boeresport* and baked bread on an open fire were another way to introduce students to the Afrikaans culture, while the yearly visits of Pit Productions brought prescribed books and poetry to life.

Aristotle said: "Educating the mind without educating the heart, is no education at all."

These wise words mirror the holistic approach to education that I encountered at Victory Park. King David schools develop critical thinking skills, ethical decision-making abilities and a strong moral compass – skills that provide a foundation for life. The remarkable accomplishments of the King David students and alumni bear witness to the high priority that Judaism places on learning.

I treasure a beautiful collage of happy images in my memory trove: dressing up for Purim and enjoying this fun-filled day with the students;

eating apples dipped in honey on Rosh Hashanah and dancing on *Yom Ha'atzmaut*, dressed in blue and white. I was always envious of these celebrations, as I realized that they provide a bridge for students between the past, present and future, creating a feeling of belonging. Multiple elegant matric farewells, vibrant and professional school productions, basking in the sun at the tuck-shop, are but a few examples of other pictures engraved in my memory.

There is also a section filled with gripping images of students and colleagues who have departed untimely. The solemn ceremonies of *Yom Hashoah* touched my soul. I am eternally grateful for the opportunity I was granted to accompany a group of students to visit the concentration and extermination camps in Poland. Standing with one of the students, Alissa Gritzman, in front of the barrack in Auschwitz- Birkenau where her grandmother (a Holocaust survivor) was incarcerated, still remains a very poignant memory to me. History and school textbooks quote numbers and dates, but the immense suffering and tragedy of these "numbers" are often not reflected. This was a life altering experience for me. I subsequently wrote an article on this topic. This was published in the Afrikaans newspaper *Beeld* and other publications, followed by a talk I presented at the Greenside Shul.

The words of Robert Heinlein that when one teaches, two learn, highlight the dual nature of teaching and learning. Expanding my knowledge

to the advantage of my students, motivated me to further enhance my academic qualifications. This would not have been possible without the kind support of the SABJE.

I feel honoured and humbled to be remembered by my students and be given this opportunity to reminisce. The closure of the Victory Park campus fills me with sadness, but the memories of the special times spent there, will always remain. Many colleagues, students and parents have become my lifelong friends: their love and support at all times will be treasured forever. As a retiree staying in the quaint village of St Francis Bay, I still have the privilege and joy to teach the children of some of my former students online.

The outstanding work of the Foundation to ensure that every Jewish child is given the opportunity of getting a Jewish education, is admirable. Every student nurtured by King David is given an incredible gift for life. May education based on Jewish values flourish and prosper for many years to come.

From starring in major theatre productions to winning prestigious awards, mentoring the next generation of performers, and championing the arts community, Vicky's journey is a powerful reflection of creativity, and the enduring value of following one's passion.

DYNAMIC DAVIDIAN

Vicky Friedman (KDL 1995)

Vicky matriculated from King David Linksfield in 1995, where she developed a strong foundation in the performing arts. Reflecting on her formative years, she credits the school's dynamic performing arts opportunities with igniting her passion and preparing her for a professional career.

After matriculating from King David Linksfield, Vicky went on to study Musical Theatre at Pretoria Technikon. She also completed an Honours Degree in Communications through The University of South Africa, balancing her academic pursuits with an active performing career. She went on to appear in major stage productions, including *Chicago*, *Hairspray*, *Annie*, and *Thoroughly Modern Millie*, as well as a range of Janice Honeyman pantomimes. She also appeared in television series establishing herself as a versatile and respected actress.

In addition to her work on stage and screen, Vicky has built a distinguished reputation as a choreographer. Her credits include *Nobody Told Me*, *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat*, *Menopause – The Musical*, *The Rocky Horror Show*, and *Beautiful Creatures*, the latter earning the Naledi Theatre Award for Best Children's Musical in 2010.

Her excellence in theatre-making has continued to be recognised. In 2026, in collaboration with Daphne Kuhn, Vicky received a prestigious Naledi Theatre Award for the sold-out production of *Diary of a Wimpy Kid*.

Vicky is also the founder of **Fame Academy**, a leading performing arts training platform

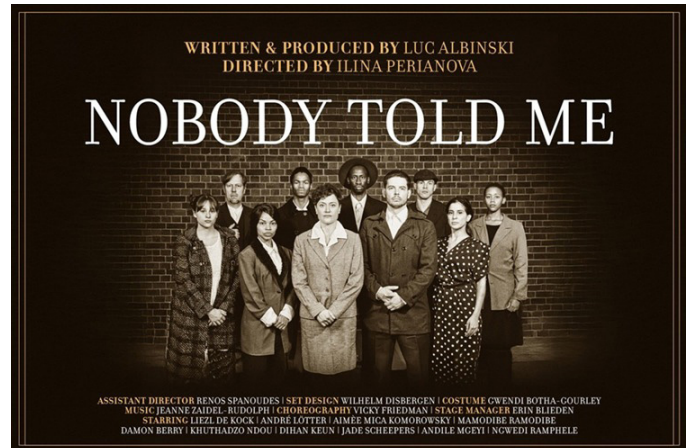
Cultivating a deep connection to prayer among King David students is essential. The DIJE prioritise morning davening sessions to enhance this spiritual experience daily.

KING DAVID ALUMNI SHINE IN THE ARTS

A King David education is rooted in the pursuit of excellence and nowhere is this more evident than in the performing arts, where creativity, discipline, collaboration and courage are actively nurtured and carried into the professional world.

Over the past six months, King David alumni have continued to distinguish themselves across theatre, film and live performance, making their mark on some of South Africa's most significant stages and productions. Their achievements reflect not only exceptional individual talent, but also a shared foundation built at King David, where students have always been encouraged to explore, create, and step confidently into spaces where they can shine.

We are incredibly proud of **Tannah Levick (KDL 2018)**, who performed in the South African production of *Cats*, the iconic Andrew Lloyd Webber musical staged in Cape Town and Johannesburg in 2025–2026. Tannah took on the role of *Rumpleteazer*, one half of the mischievous “Jellicle twins” (*Rumpleteazer and Mungojerrie*), a high-energy role that demands exceptional physical theatre, strong vocal ability and precise comedic timing.



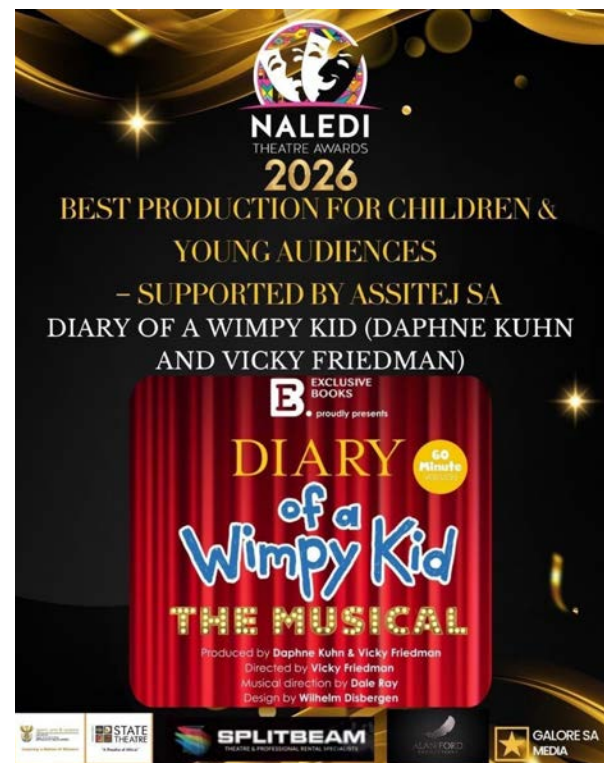
In the deeply moving production *Nobody Told Me*, staged in January 2026, King David talent was represented both on and off stage. The play tells the true Holocaust story of hidden identity, courage and remembrance, inspired by Dr Halina Rotstein and the memories of her daughter, Wanda. Told through Wanda's perspective as an elderly woman and her son, the production moves between present-day reflection and wartime Warsaw in the 1930s and 1940s.

We are proud of our three talented alumnae, **Vicky Friedman (KDL 1995)** - choreographer; **Erin Blieden (KDVP 2018)** - stage manager and production assistant; and **Aimee Mica Komorowsky (KDL 2006)** - actress, alongside King David High School drama teacher, Renos Spanoudes, who served as assistant director. Their involvement is testament to the exceptional talent and moral purpose which a King David education carries beyond the classroom.

This spirit of impact and excellence was further recognised at the 2026 Naledi Awards, where King David alumnae earned multiple nominations and accolades across leading categories.

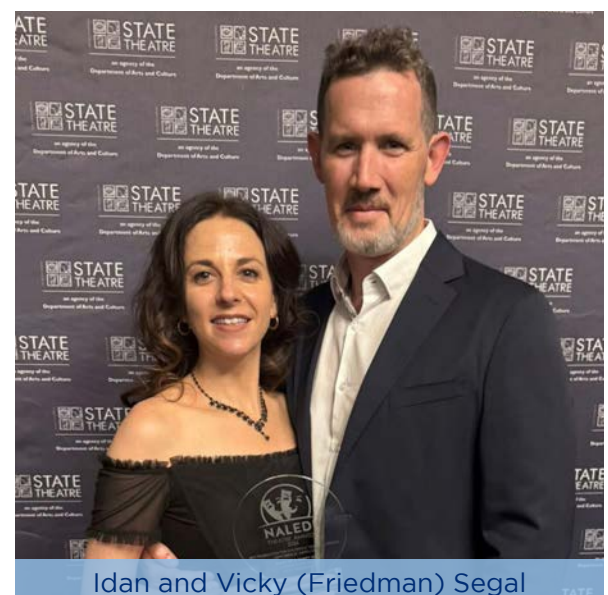
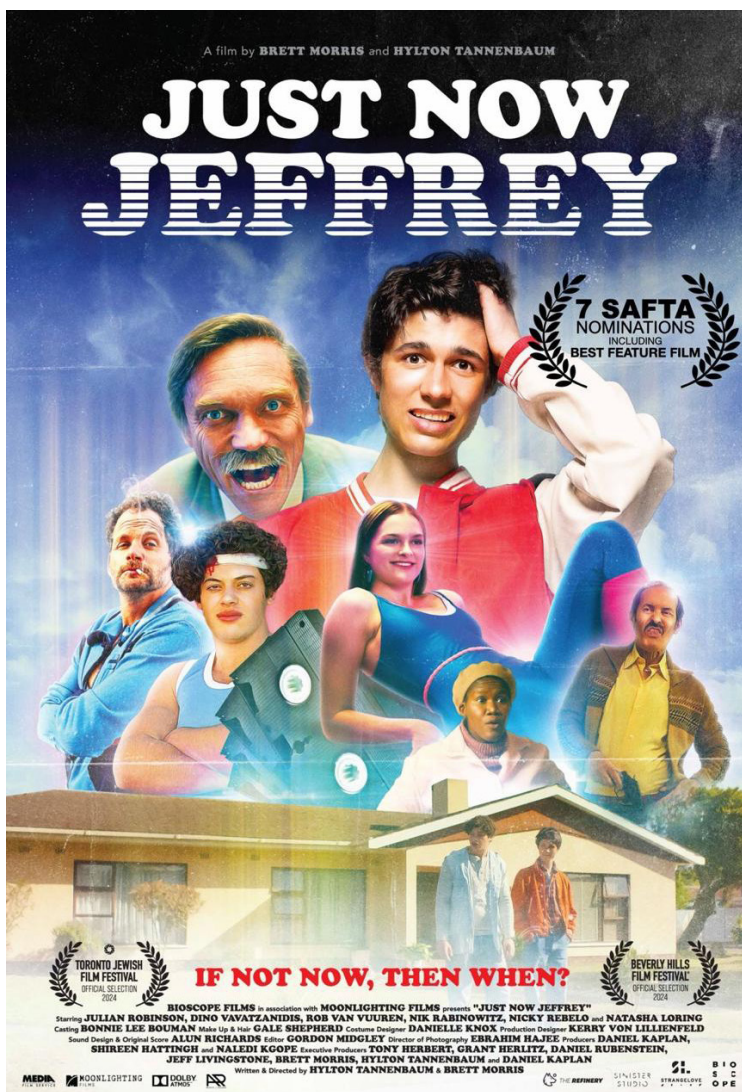
Aimee Mica Komorowsky (KDL 2006) received two nominations for *Sarajevo*, including Best Lead Performance in a Play (Female) and Best New South African Script/Adaptation. **Micaela Tucker (KDVP 2016)** was nominated for Best Performance in a Solo Comedy Production for her one-woman show, *A Doll's Life*. **Vicky Friedman (KDL 1995)** was named **WINNER** as producer of *Diary of a Wimpy Kid*, receiving the award for Best Production for Children & Young Audiences.

On screen, King David's creative footprint was equally significant at the 2026 SAFTA Awards, where *Just Now Jeffrey*, an award-winning coming-of-age comedy set in 1980s South Africa, received an outstanding seven nominations, including Best Feature Film. The film was written and directed by **Brett Morris (KDVP 1989)** and **Hylton Tannenbaum (KDVP 1989)**, with a wide network of King David alumni contributing to its production, including **Tony Herbert (KDVP 1990)**, **Grant Herlitz (KDVP 1989)**,



Daniel Rubenstein (KDL 2000), **Steven Kapeluschnik (KDVP 1989)**, **Jason Nestadt (KDL 1995)**, **Daryn Mofsowitz (KDL 1995)**, **Allan Sweidan (KDL 1987)**, **Dion Bregman (KDL 1988)**, **Phillipa (Lissoos) Bregman (KDVP 1989)**, **Fran (Bermeister) Tannenbaum (KDVP 1989)** and **Tami (Levin) Morris (KDL 1995)**. 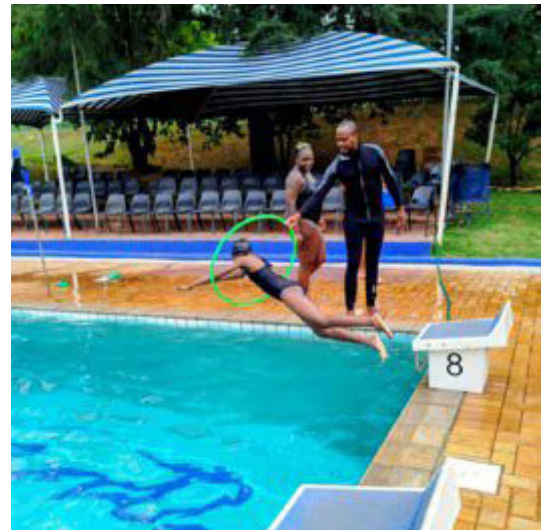


King David High School: Alexandra Youth Swim Academy

In 2023, the Alexandra Youth Swim Academy project was launched at King David Linksfield as a 12-week programme with the objective of teaching children from Alexandra township a life-saving skill: how to swim. What began as small project, now sees more than 60 children bussed to the Linksfield campus every Sunday for professional coaching with instructors from Aquatics Gauteng, supported by King David student volunteers. After the demanding swimming lesson, the Alexandra students are given a nutritious meal provided by Afrika Tikkun and the KDSF and then interact with KD students from the Outreach Committee.

During March, programme director Lawrence Ruele addressed the school and thanked our students and community for giving these children a safe, uplifting space and a lifesaving skill.

The KDSF is incredibly grateful to our donors whose generosity enables our students and staff to turn values into action - a powerful example of our school's commitment to Tikkun Olam.





King David Primary School Linksfield: Stationery Packing and Distribution

Dora Miller arrived from Lithuania in 1931. She married Morris Seeff in 1943. Today at 102, she lives with her daughter and is surrounded by most of her family.

She had four children (the eldest has passed away); Ruth, Denise, Joyce and Bernard. Of her four children only her youngest, Bernard, went to King David (KDL 1971). However, her grandchildren and great-grandchildren have been (or are still) going through the King David system.

This year, 2026, she has 6 great-grandchildren in Grade 8 at King David High School (pictured left). All their parents were graduates of King David Linksfield.

Two of her grandchildren were head girls of the Linksfield campus; Tami (Levin) Morris (KDL 1995) and Bianca (Seeff) Rubenstein (KDL 2003). Her great grandson, Greg Landau was head boy at the Victory Park campus in 2023.

Twelve of Dora's grandchildren, and 8 of her many great-grandchildren have matriculated from King David Schools. They have all matriculated with many distinctions between them, and have gone on to become accountants, engineers, doctor, lawyers and architects.

During their school years, they all participated in the various activities the

school offers, and when asked what her grandchildren and great-grandchildren gained from their school experience, the answers were wide and diverse:

Some enjoyed the opportunity to perform school plays and even produce plays. They acted in musicals and have danced and sung in many productions.

All were grateful for friendships and connection to networks, which have lasted long after leaving school. They are all deeply aware of their Jewish identity and feel great pride in Israel and all its achievements.

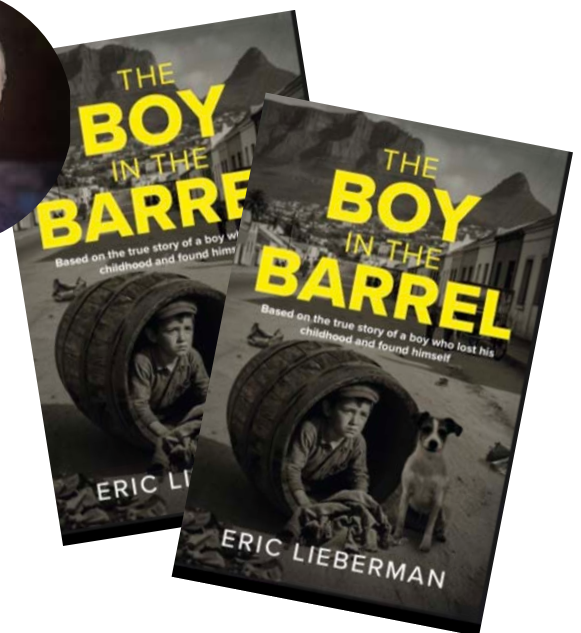
Dylan Martheze (KDVP 2020)

REZOOMIONS

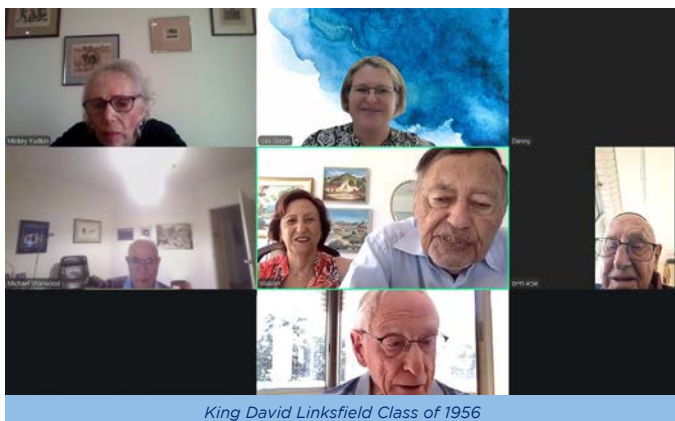
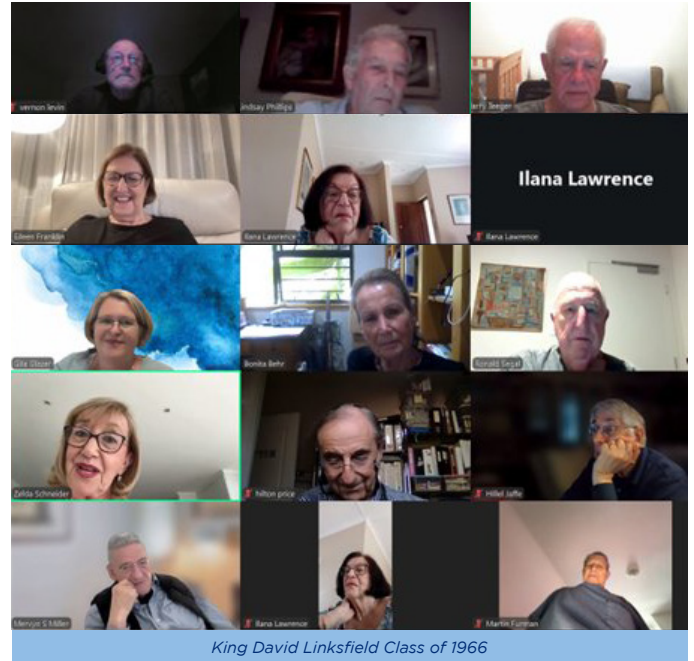

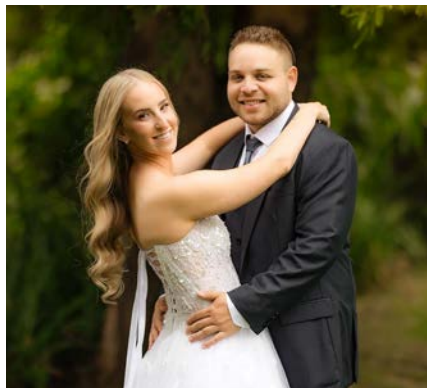
